2024 and selected the second ranked firm, DAG Architects. The committee recommended approval of the contract for \$1,274,766.

4.2 Recommendation of Approval of Shortlist of architectural firms for the Gulf Franklin Campus, Multi-Purpose Classroom and Shelter Project.

The Capital Planning and Facilities Committee met in a second meeting on December 4, 2024 to shortlist firms for design services for the Gulf/Franklin Campus Multi-Purpose Classroom and Emergency Shelter.

4.3 Recommendation of Approval to Issue Purchase Orders Utilizing Deferred Maintenance Funds for HVAC, Roofing and Irrigation Repairs.

The college received Federal Stimulus funds to cover eligible repairs and improvements. The original amount was to fund six (6) projects and most all funds are either expended or obligated by the December 31,2024 as required. The college requested a budget realignment of the funds to account for projects that came in under or above the original estimates. As the college received approval of all budget realignment requests, a recommendation of approval to issue purchase orders for the following:

Roofing repairs and improvements to the Language and Literature
Building, Health Sciences Building, Administration Building, and the
Charles Hilton Center per the attached Weatherproofing Technologies, Inc.
Proposal #5065886, an E&I Cooperative Competitively-Bid Contract \$339,950.57

Repairs and upgrades to HVAC systems in the Amelia Tapper Center, Natatorium, and Rosenwald Classroom Building per the attached WTI Pure Air Services, Inc. Proposal #5065886, an E&I Cooperative Competitively-Bid Contract - \$656,196.17

Repairs and upgrades to Pump House and irrigation systems per the attached Ferguson Proposal #B104618, an E&I Cooperative

Competitively-Bid Contract - \$129,822.08

Estimated additional related supplies to be purchased directly by college. \$ 40,022.12

Total: \$1,165,990.94
