Like many of you, I feel this summer has seemingly gone by in a flash! Our Upward Bound (UB) team hosted participants for a six-week summer program during June and July. Among other things, UB students

learned about Web Coding, S.T.E.M., and Acting. The Educational Opportunity Center (EOC) stayed extremely busy, too, helping students apply for college and fill out financial aid applications such as the FAFSA. So much so, in fact, that the EOC is only a few participants away from meeting its overall yearly benchmark. Last but not least, Student Support Services (SSS) wrote and submitted a proposal to renew its funding. If the U.S. Department of Education approves that request, SSS will receive approximately \$1,500,000 for September 1st, 2025, through August 31st, 2030.

In addition to regular services, UB and SSS took participants on a college tour of New Orleans. On the first day, students toured the University of New Orleans and Blaine Kern Studios—which builds Mardi Gras floats, props, and masks. Students then toured Loyola University, Tulane University, and the World War II Museum during day two. The third day concluded with an Airboat tour of Louisiana swamps and alligators. On our way back to Panama City, we asked participants to complete an online survey to evaluate the trip. Although every student positively rated their experience, the following comment stood out as a testament to TRiO's value:

"I really enjoyed the activities, and tours we did. It was very hot on the tours but was beautiful and incredibly informational. The trip sends a reminder to me that the world is so much bigger than Panama City. Also, as someone who doesn't have a lot of money, or didn't grow up with money, it's incredible to be able to see some parts of the world without having to worry about money.
